Joint Statement on situation in Côte d'Ivoire

Caobisco, ECA and FCC members witness with increasing concern further deterioration of the situation in Côte d'Ivoire, and fully share in the despair of the Ivorian population.

We deeply regret that a political solution has not been found yet, and we continue to commend efforts for a speedy restoration of peace.

We duly note the publication, on 10th March, of the statement by the spokesperson to EU High Representative Catherine Ashton regarding the obligations of European economic operators with respect to trade in goods from Côte d'Ivoire.

As previously reported, our members' operations in Côte d'Ivoire in terms of procurement and processing of cocoa are severely hindered, while exports of cocoa have come to a standstill; likewise, "in country" sustainability programs have been seriously curtailed.

Despite these difficult circumstances, the members of Caobisco, ECA & FCC remain committed to the millions of people in cocoa farming communities whose livelihoods depend on cocoa.

The safety of our members' employees in Côte d'Ivoire is our highest and most immediate priority.

We remain committed to working with the people of Côte d'Ivoire for the long term viability of the cocoa sector.
